OSHA's Top 10 Violations 2016

Fall Protection, **6,929 citations** - 39.9% of deaths in the Construction industry are fall related. Roofing, framing & single family contractors were the most cited employers.

- Hazard Communications, 5,677 citations OSHA found numerous instances of inadequate training, lack of data sheets & unaddressed chemical exposure controls.
 - **Scaffolding, 3,906 citations -** Framing, roofing, siding & masonry contactors were among the most cited employers. Improper assembly and access to scaffolding were noted.
- **Respiratory Protection, 3,585 citations -** Employees wore respirators but were not medically evaluated, were put in situations with overexposure to contaminants or weren't properly fit-tested for respirators.
 - **Lockout/Tagout, 3,414 citations -** Employees were not trained in proper procedures, procedures were non-existent or employers did not perform inspections of procedures.
 - Powered Industrial Trucks, 2,860 citations Investigators found operators who lacked certification, were not trained on the hazards associated within the facility & workers who did not maintain safe use of the vehicle.
 - **Ladders**, **2,639 citations** Improper use of portable ladders, ladders not being used according to their design & lack of training were amongst the most cited hazards.
 - Machine Guarding 2,451 citations As well as inadequate machine guarding, inspectors saw machinery that was not anchored/fixed as it should be and the use of tools to operate machinery which cause bazards
 - **Electrical Wiring 1,940 citations -** Unsafe substitutes for permanent wiring and incorrect use of extension cords
 - 10 Electrical, General Requirements, 1,740 citations
 Most common offences included electrical equipment not installed properly or used in accordance with recommended use.
